

YOUR CIVIL RIGHTS UNDER TITLE VI

MAKING A TITLE VI COMPLAINT

Any person who believes he/she has been subjected to discrimination in the delivery of or access to public transportation services on the basis of race, color, or national origin, may file a complaint with the Paducah Transit Authority (PATS). Such complaint must be filed in writing with Paducah Transit Authority (PATS) no later than 5 days after the alleged discrimination. Written complaints may also be filed with the U. S. Department of Transportation/Federal Transit Administration (FTA) no later than 180 days after the date of the alleged discrimination, at the following address: Office of Civil Rights, Attention: Title VI Program Coordinator, East Building, 5th Floor-TCR, 1200 New Jersey Ave., SE, Washington, DC 20590.
